From the SEO...

The Beverly Sail & Power Squadron educational program is in full swing. Unfortunately we are sad to report that there are not any students. Although we offered a good selection of courses, insufficient enrollment in any one course prevented us from conducting the classes. However, the next chance to enroll is now. We have scheduled Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Sail, and Weather to start in January. If you wish to participate please register as soon as possible so the material can be ordered and the instructor can prepare for class. Check our web site, (www.beverly-usps.org) for details and the complete schedule of courses for our members. You can register by email (Beverlyps@comcast.com), telephone (978-777-4740) or regular mail (P/R/C Dick Winskowicz, 21 West St, Danvers, MA 01923. Or, the best way, see me at the meeting. Don't miss out on the best value in learning.

If your schedule does not allow you to take one of the scheduled courses or you wish to take a course not cur-

rently offered, please let us know. When we prepare the schedule of classes it we use the "best guess" method of what the membership wants. If we guess wrong, all is not lost. Let us know! We will try to make every effort to reschedule the classes for the convenience of the membership. We also would appreciate any comments relative to our educational program. Your ideas and criticism is wanted to make Beverly Sail and Power Squadron the place you want to get your boating education. We need your input.

The Squadron Boating course is in process with 22 students. John Hagar and Jim Curran are doing a bang up job in educating these inexperienced boaters. Power boater John keeps the class involved with his maritime "war stories", and Sailor Jim tries to keep John on board with the use of the new electronic presentations. They are a good pair of instructors and complement each other providing the students with a wealth of boating experience.

All of our course instructors have been certified by the National USPS organization. If you have been certified, you should have received a certificate stating

so in the mail. Certification is especially important for the public boating course instructors. As of January 2006, any member who teaches any portion of the boating class must be certified as a qualified instructor. This is a NASBLA (National Association of Safe Boating Law Administrators) requirement to keep our courses nationally approved. If we missed anyone who feels they are also qualified or anyone who wants to be qualified, let us know. The requirements are simple. The method for obtaining certification to teach any and all courses is by passing the USPS Instructor Development (ID) Course. Successful completion of ID will result in the issuance of a USPS Instructor's Certificate valid for four years from the date of ID course completion. The ID course is scheduled for March, 2006. Also, members with certain pre-qualifications may request an initial four-year certification without completing the Instructor Development Course.

Current members with such pre-qualifications who may request an initial four-year USPS certification are:

1. Members who hold active, current teaching credentials from an accredited teaching organization;
2. Members who have taught for at least three years within the last five calendar years in an adult education community program or as a college instructor.
3. Members who have completed either the USPS IQ Course or both the USPS IT and IA courses, and who have had significant USPS classroom or public presentation experience during the last three years.

Other members who have completed either IQ or both IT and IA but have had no significant USPS classroom or public presentation experience during the past three years must complete a four-hour ID recertification seminar described below to qualify for initial four-year certification. As defined above, initial USPS instructor certification is valid for four years. Re-certification of all instructors requires completion of the USPS four-hour ID re-certification seminar.

On another note, the National Educational Department has been very busy updating our member courses. A new Seamanship course will soon be available. This completely re-written course compliments the new Piloting and Advanced Piloting courses. It addresses topics of immediate interest to the modern boater. It has also been "demodularized" and will be presented as one complete course. This is typical of the rest of the educational program. The modular concept is fading away and being replaced with much improved and pertinent material.

The Squadron Boating Course and Boat Smart are being combined into a new two part public boating course. Part one will be very similar to Boat Smart and part two similar to Chart Smart. These completely re-written courses will replace all existing USPS public boating courses. They will be up to date with the latest in elec-

tronic technology and filled with dynamic and colorful in-class presentations. Part one should be available next fall and replace Boat Smart. Part two, charting will follow and the Squadron Boating course will be replaced. with both parts. An exam will be offered after each part. Only part one is required for NAASBLA recognition. #

Administrative Officer Report:

Lt/C Alex Pszenny told members he is in the process of lining up speakers for upcoming meetings. Alex gave a few topics he is thinking about: Fisheries Science/Management, Law Enforcement/Marine, Marine Science, Oceanography, messing around with boats, or cruising. Alex is open to suggestions and ideas, and welcomes e-mails. Commander Ed Libby mentioned also that Alex is himself a great source of information as a speaker, too.

Executive Officer Report: Lt/C Alex Arcisz talked about the many vacant positions on various committees. Especially, the most recent one of Safety Officer that had been held by the late Lt Michael T. Berry. A suggestion that Matt Fitzgerald take on the vacant position of Safety Officer. Members agreed that Matt should hold this position.

Navigation: Dex Wheeler is the instructor - starts Oct. 4.
Engine Maintenance: Herb Ryan - need at least 4 students to have the class
Cruise Planning: Ed Walsh- requires 6-10 students to have the class
Instructor Development: no cost to members-instructor is Linda Seal-starts March 4, 2006
Boat Smart - instructor Dick Winkowicz-starts March 20, 2006
Boating: instructor John Hagar-course starts October 4.
Marine Electronics: John Graves-starts October 6, Module 101, 102, 103.
Weather: instructor John Bedrosian and Bill Veno-starts in Jan.

Following supper, Sgt. Michael Andreas, Salem Police Department will be our guest speaker. His topic will relate to local homeland security issues, with an emphasis on the marine side.



Michael Andreas is a detective sergeant with the Salem Police Department, and has been with the force for nine years. Shortly after 9/11, Mike was promoted to the newly created job of intelligence officer, with the primary mission of combating terrorism and maintaining the community's homeland security. He is also the department's training officer.

Mike is also an instructor at the Massachusetts Police Academy in Reading, where he teaches courses in ethics, crime scenes, interview and interrogation, investigative techniques and terrorism.

Prior to joining the Salem P.D., Mike served as assistant commandant at Norwich University in Vermont, the oldest military college in the country, his alma mater. A former captain in the United States Army, Mike is a combat veteran of the first Gulf War, where he served as a cavalry officer and received a Bronze Star Medal.

He recently returned from a trip to the White House, where he was one of two local police officers invited to brief members of the President's homeland security team on the local effort to prevent terrorism.

Mike holds both bachelor and master degrees in criminal justice. He lives in Danvers, with his wife and two young sons.





